

After retiring as parish priest at St. Theresa's in Woodbrook, Fr. Peter Nicholson resided at Fatima College for approximately ten years. Although he was



not directly involved with the school, he made his home among us. Our staff and student body grew accustomed to seeing him walking around on the college compound. Oftentimes he was seated on the savannah type benches located outside the various form classes enjoying either the cool morning or evening breezes in the company of his devoted and loyal caregiver, Joyce. During the course of the day, he had his special spots where he would sit, enjoying the atmosphere and buzzing activities of an all boys college. As he moved on in age, it happened that he would wander into a nearby classroom and was gently guided back to his room. He always greeted us with a smile and seemed to be so contented sitting on the savannah bench.

We were saddened when he passed away. On the morning of the 26th April, 2006, the school community had the honour of bidding farewell to Fr. Nick. Our 1st Fatima Sea Scouts received the hearse upon its arrival and it was escorted to the inner courtyard where a brief memorial service was conducted. Some of our staff members lifted the casket onto the courtyard while our scouts performed their duties with dignity and reverence as they stood in a guard of honour beside his body in the casket. The entire student body listened attentively and respectfully as various aspects of his life were highlighted such as being an avid footballer and a keen scout.

As the service ended, our scouts again accompanied the hearse to the college gate saluting a life that brought laughter and cheer to many a brother and sister on their journey of life. Thank you Fr. Nick for teaching us in your own unique way the importance of taking some time off from our hectic day to simply sit back ... take cognizance of ... and enjoy all that is happening around us. 














#### Mr. Maurice Brash

Fatima College has satisfied all of my expectations.







There is no use in trying to pigeonhole 2006 National Trumpet Competition winner Etienne Charles. One listen to his debut album Culture Shock shows the depth and breadth of his varied musical heritage. From the Calypso and Caribbean steel pan grooves of his native Trinidad, to sophisticated swing firmly rooted in the jazz tradition, Charles deftly incorporates a multitude of styles while maintaining continuity, freshness and maturity in his sound that is often lacking in other players of his generation.

Twenty-three-year-old Etienne Charles comes from a rich legacy of musical tradition. Already Charles is a celebrated award-winning trumpeter. At Fatima College in Trinidad, Charles was the first three-time winner of the coveted Provincial Cup, the youngest person to ever receive the award at

age 13. In 2002 he began his studies at Florida State University and in 2006 he graduated as Brautlecht Scholar of the College of Music, where he studied jazz with legendary pianist Marcus Roberts. He is currently pursuing a Masters degree in Jazz Studies at the Julliard School. Charles has been awarded the IAJE Award for Outstanding Service to Jazz Education and a Special Citation for Outstanding Musicianship.

In 2006 he recorded on the album Elevation featuring Eddie Daniels and Tom Scott, which received two Grammy nominations. He has shared the stage with Grammy Award winners Roberta Flack and Ralph MacDonald, jazz piano great Marcus Roberts, Maria Schneider, Johnny Mandel, Rene Marie, Gerald Wilson and a host of others.



Etienne Charles is a product of Fatima College, a talented, creative soul with a vision and the will to bring it to the world.










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#### Brian Lara By Glen Roach



I always encourage batsmen to develop the habit of making centuries. This is what attracts attention of the press, the public and most of all, the selectors. One cricketer who did not need this advice was Brian Lara. He simply had a voracious appetite for runs.

I heard about Brian from Harry Ramdass. He was the perfect batsman. I had to see him and

I went to look for him. I could not believe my eyes. All these runs flowing from the bat of this tiny, slender lad who seemed

so quiet, shy and introverted? When I first saw him in the nets, I became an instant Lara fan. I have followed his career ever since then, from youth level, national trials, national selection to West Indies player.

You see, cricket is the game I love. I just love to be on a cricket ground especially in the country immersed in the cricket culture. You experience everything in a day's play – joy, sorrow, frustration, anger, hope, brilliance, mediocrity, food, fun, humour, heckle, politics, philosophy and friendships. Cricket is the game that caused us to soar to excellence. What a thrill to

be teaching in an institution with the greatest batsman I have ever seen, and I have seen Weekes, Richards, Sobers, Kanhai, Gavaskar, Chappel, Walters, Zaheer, Majid, Greenidge.

I was impressed with his sheer brilliance. I was even more impressed with his approach to the game – the way he dressed, practiced, prepared, spoke, analysed. I saw him once scolding some player for their casual attitude. He was already on the field, ready to go while some were still tying their laces.

I know I disappointed him once and I felt very badly. I had organised a match and I could not find eleven players. It was a casual encounter. Few took it seriously. There was Brian, immaculately dressed with bat, bag of equipment and a helmet.

Sorry Brian. I retired that day from organizing cricket matches.

I saw Brian make runs for Trinidad, Queen's Park, North, West Indies. I never saw him make runs for Fatima. His dismissals generally coincided with my arrivals. On Saturdays, I would be watching him bat while I taught my class. I would hurry across to the field. Out, Brian out! In one match, I rushed to St. Mary's grounds. Brian and Carew got out immediately!

I did see his century in a trial match. In fact, I sat next to Bunty Lara and I had to talk to him during the nervous nineties. I saw his 92 against Barbados. I did not see his tears when he was given out in very controversial circumstances.

What do I think about Brian Lara? He is simply a genius with the bat, a normal, human, fun-loving person off the field. He set high

standards for himself. He could not lift others to do so. He alone had to shoulder the responsibility for the near collapse of West Indies cricket. Forget about overage players, momentous debt, contractual disputes, row with Desmond Haynes, Vivian Richards, Holding, Dujohn, under-prepared pitches, insularity. He was West Indies greatest cricketing asset. Some considered him a liability.

To you, Brian, I say thanks. I remember the day you came to my class to visit Jonathan Daniel, to cheer up this sick child. Thanks for

the financial contributions to our fundraising ventures. Thanks for inviting us to your home. What a bundle of joy was young Sydney (Lara's daughter.) I remember how she hugged you when you were leaving for the hotel. "Daddy, why yuh always going to play cricket?" she asked.

I remembered when you were selected for Trinidad and Tobago. You were happy but you were upset about Dhanraj's omission. What a loyal friend. Brian, I still hope to see you in action, maybe for Queen's Park but not against my team, Ceramic Merryboys! Thanks.


Scrabble Club
