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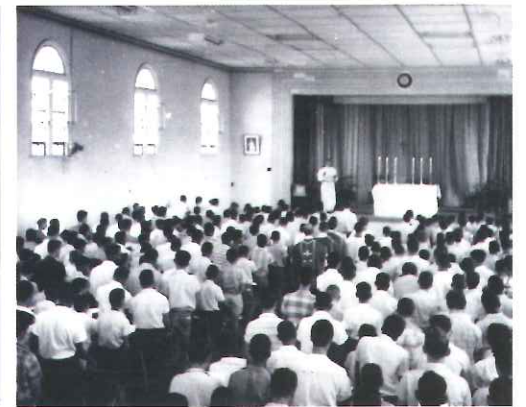

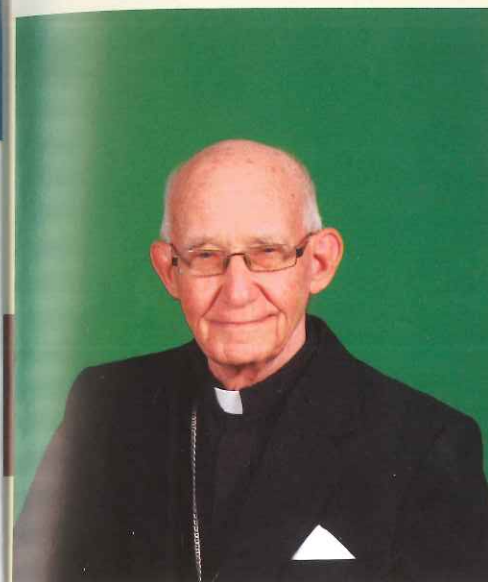

INTERVIEW WITH FATHER GREGORY ON FATHER GERRY FARFAN

Father Jerry Farfan was born in year 1939 and died on 2014. He was a holy ghost father who lived at the college for many years and played a significant role in the development of the school.



When did Father Farfan come to Fatima?

He came to Fatima in the 1950's and he was a major player in Fatima's development.

What were some of the contributions that he made to Fatima?

He was responsible for a lot of the physical developments of the compound. He built the AV center, designed and built the pavilion, restructured the residence of the father's of congregation and then went on to become vice principal of Fatima upon Father Ryan's retirement in 1972. He was responsible for the college's timetable, was a founding member of the college's league and very significantly, he was instrumental in drafting the constitution of TTUTA.

How long was he the vice principal?

He was vice principal for four years until 1976 when he was transferred to St Marys College and I do say I think he went reluctantly because he really loved his time at Fatima.

What would you say is your fondest memory of father Farfan?

He was an environmentalist and even in those days when people didn't know that concept of having to save the environment he still managed to get people to understand that. He loved to hike and he actually sometimes took students on hikes. Whenever I see national geographic magazine I think of him because he loved that magazine and had a subscription. I will always remember that whenever you went into his office you could see a number of them on his desk.

What would you say his students would remember him for?

He gave you a sense that the world was his domain and that really taught you something as a youngster. He saw God's world was a gift that we had to tend to and that good people had to take up that mantle of responsibility and always drummed that into you so I am sure that they would remember his preaching about that.

GIFTS OF BLUE & GOLD 2013 & 2014

Although a relatively new tradition at Fatima College, Gifts of Blue & Gold, often called GOBAG for short, has become a significant event on the College's school calendar. Originating in November 2009, the concert was organized as a fundraiser for the Form 5 Graduation of the class of 2010. In addition, it was an opportunity to showcase the talented students of the College, creating a space to celebrate those "gifted" in the various performing arts of music, dance and drama. The production's title is, of course, metaphorical. Given the fact that blue and gold are the primordial colours of the College, the concert seeks to highlight that the boys of Fatima College are gifted and more so, are themselves "gifts" to us all. For four years, the concert varied in theme but never diminished in standard and, furthermore, always seemed to out-do its predecessors.



In November 2013, the Fatima College community saw Gifts of Blue & Gold 5. In that year, the Holy Ghost Fathers, founders of our College, celebrated 150 years of their work in Trinidad and so the concert was dedicated to them. The first half of the production featured various aspects of the history, ethos and mission of the Spiritans. Using the basic tenets of Musical Theatre, the audience, in Act I was privy to a conversation between two students – a Library Prefect played by Eamon Young and a Junior student (Rynard Best-Jiminez on Friday; Khalil Alleyne on Saturday; Brendan Persad on Sunday). The younger student was being guided by the Library Prefect for a research project about the Holy Ghost Fathers for his Religion Class. Appropriate vocal and instrumental pieces as well as dance and dramatic scenes brought this very informative conversation even more to

life. In the 2nd half, the tribute to the Holy Ghost Fathers continued with the theme "Celebrating the Year of Faith" which was a year declared by Pope Benedict Emeritus that began in October 2012 and incidentally ended on the final night of GOBAG 5 – Sunday 24th November, 2013. The entire production was not only enjoyable but deeply moving where tears were being wiped away not just by the audience but by many of the performers right there on stage.

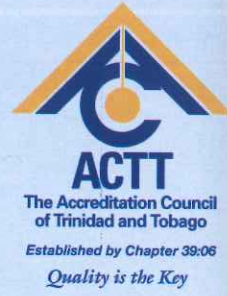
The 6th edition of GOBAG was quite different thematically from the previous production. The focus of the show was "the child" given the many tragic stories of children all across the land. The first half was entitled "Prayers of the Children" and four cast members led the audience in

intercessory prayer for the Children of our nation and each prayer was echoed by appropriately selected music. In the 2nd half, we saw two stories – stories of children as victims but also stories of children as victorious. Music was selected that allowed the audience to confront the pain of children in our society but also to sit in reflection and celebrate the children for the strength they have inside.

As usual, both the 5th and 6th installments of Gifts of Blue & Gold showcased the brilliance of our students in the Performing Arts. The Holy Name Convent Choir continues to play a pivotal role in the success of the production and in GOBAG 6, the students of Sacred Heart Boys' R.C (many of them having brothers at Fatima College) joined the cast in celebration of the children.

It is hoped that Gifts of Blue & Gold will be staged for many years to come. It represents the work and dedication of many stakeholders of our great institution and without a doubt, it is a source of pride for anyone associated with Fatima College. One can look back at the past six productions with awe and admiration for what was accomplished.

Gifts of Blue & Gold 7 is scheduled for November 27th – 29th of this year! Its theme will be kept secret for now but it is poised to be a grand celebration that may very well be the very best edition yet! We wait in joyful hope, all the while cherishing always the amazing students of Fatima College, our "gifts of blue & gold".

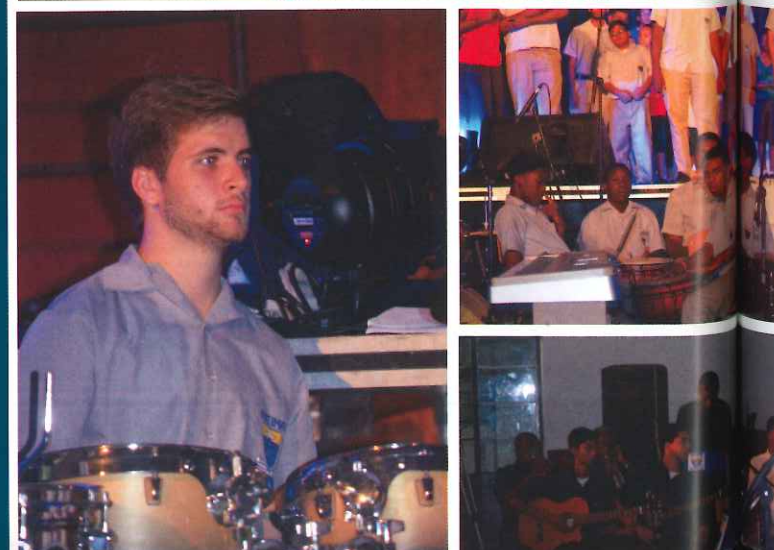
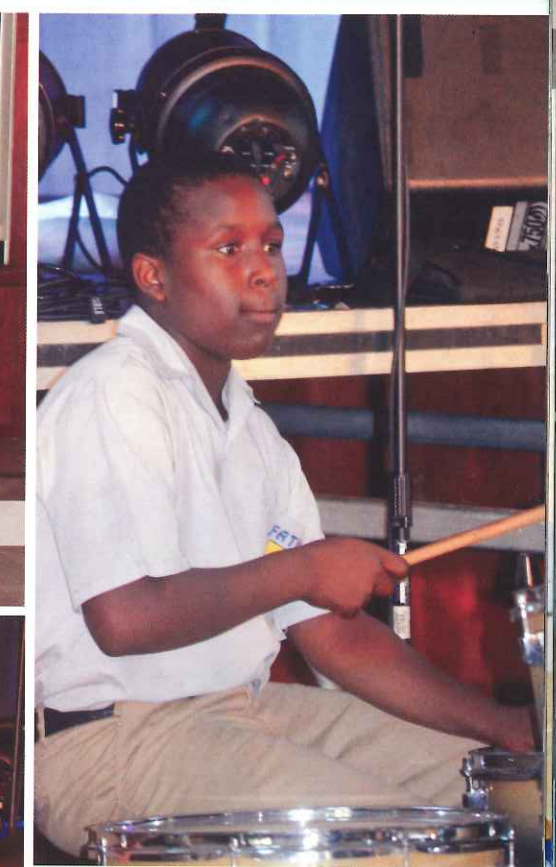

Music Festival, as it is commonly called, is normally held every two years. Singers and instrumentalists from all across the country come together to showcase their talent in a competitive setting. The last Biennial Music Festival was staged in March 2012 and though there was the expectation of another in 2014, for a myriad of reasons, the Festival was cancelled. The organizers of the event realized that in so doing the next Festival would be carded for 2016 and agreed that the gap of four years was too huge, and as a result, it was decided that each zone - North, South and Tobago would each have its own Youth Music Festival. The Tobago committee held its Festival in 2014 and the North and South committees staged theirs in March 2015.

Over the years, Fatima College has been no stranger to the Festival and this was maintained in the College's participation in the Youth Music Festival 2015. Among the classes in which Fatima was represented were:

- Boys' Vocal Solo 12 – 15 years
- Boys' Vocal Solo 16 – 19 years
- Contemporary Religious Solo 12 – 19 years



- Secondary School Choirs Lower Voices
- Junior Choirs Open Lower Voices
- Junior Pan Ensemble
- Boys' Vocal Trio 19 years & under
- Piano Duet 16 – 19 years
- Steel Pan Solo 16 – 19 years

The College was named Champions in a number of these categories including both Boys' Vocal solo classes (Adam Mohammed of Form 1 and Daniel Roberts of Lower 6); both Lower Voices Choir classes (The Fatima College Senior Choir); the Boys' Vocal Trio (Savion Burke, Joshua Raymond and Daniel Roberts); and Jerome Ifill of Form 5 being part of the pair that won the Piano Duet class.

It may be argued, however, that another sign of victory is that Fatima College continues to excel in the Festival and stands out among boys' schools in terms of participation in the Festival. This fact speaks to the ethos of the College of striving and conquering in all aspects of one's life. It is hoped that the College will continue to show supremacy in Music and the Choral Art and that the Music Festival of 2016 will result in yet another powerful story of success through song for the College of Our Lady of Fatima.

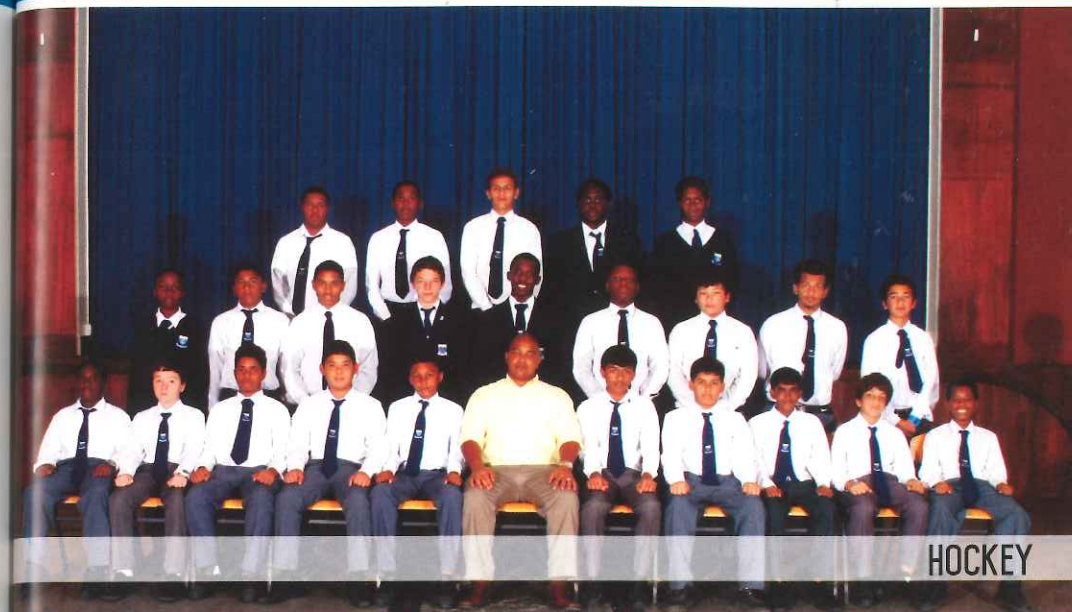
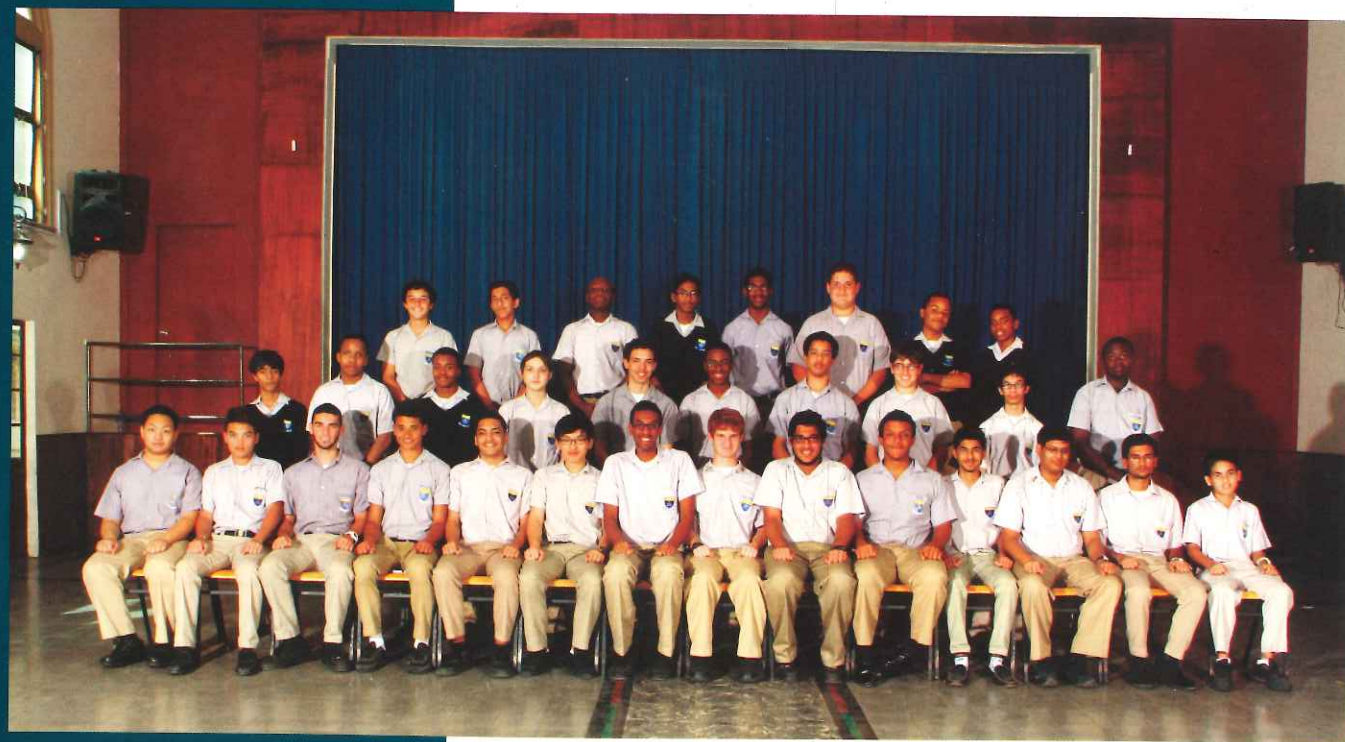
The Mathematics Olympiad

consists of two levels. Level 1 is sat by thousands of students throughout the nation in September of each year. It is administered by the Australian Mathematics Trust. The outstanding students from Level 1 go on to sit the Level 2 exam which is administered by the University of the West Indies in January of each year. The results of the Level 2 exam are then used in the selection of a small group of students to undergo training with the view of selecting a six-member team to represent Trinidad & Tobago at the International Mathematics Olympiad.

In 2013, 2014 and 2015, two students from Fatima College were selected to represent Trinidad & Tobago at the International Mathematics Olympiad in Columbia, South Africa and Thailand respectively. Stephen Yearwood and Alex Navarro were selected out of approximately 5000 students to represent Trinidad &

Tobago on the six-member national team at the International Mathematics Olympiad. For three (3) consecutive years, these brilliant young men would have represented Fatima College and Trinidad & Tobago at the most prestigious international Mathematics competition.

Given that our last national team representative was in 2002, this signifies a fortified re-emergence of Fatima College's dexterity and skill in the field of Mathematics on a national level. It is also a reflection of the depth of knowledge and training that is offered by the Mathematics department at Fatima College. In addition, Fatima College also participates in the Euclid Examination, which is administered by the University of Waterloo, and it has achieved a ranking in the top 400 out of 13,000 candidates worldwide in recent years.

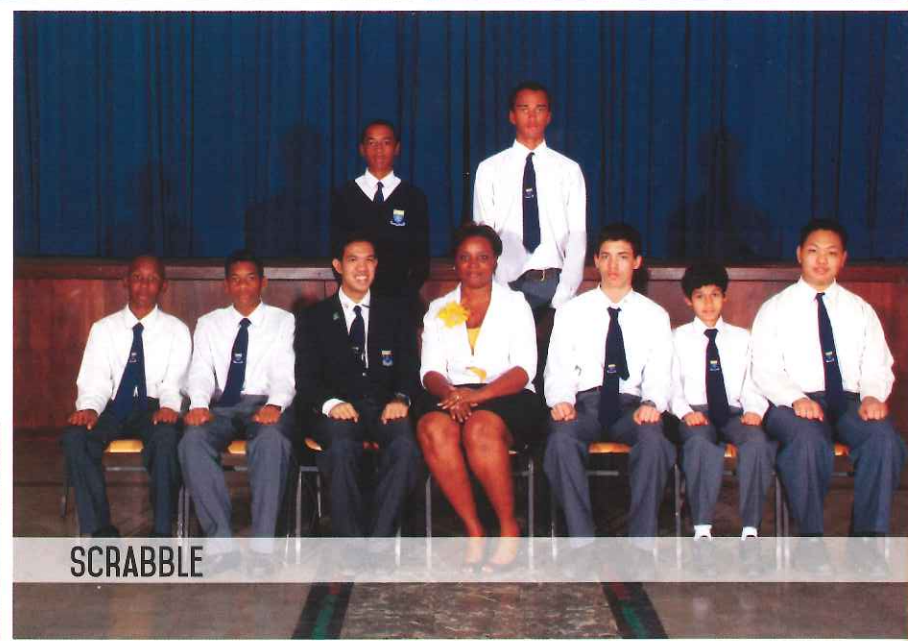

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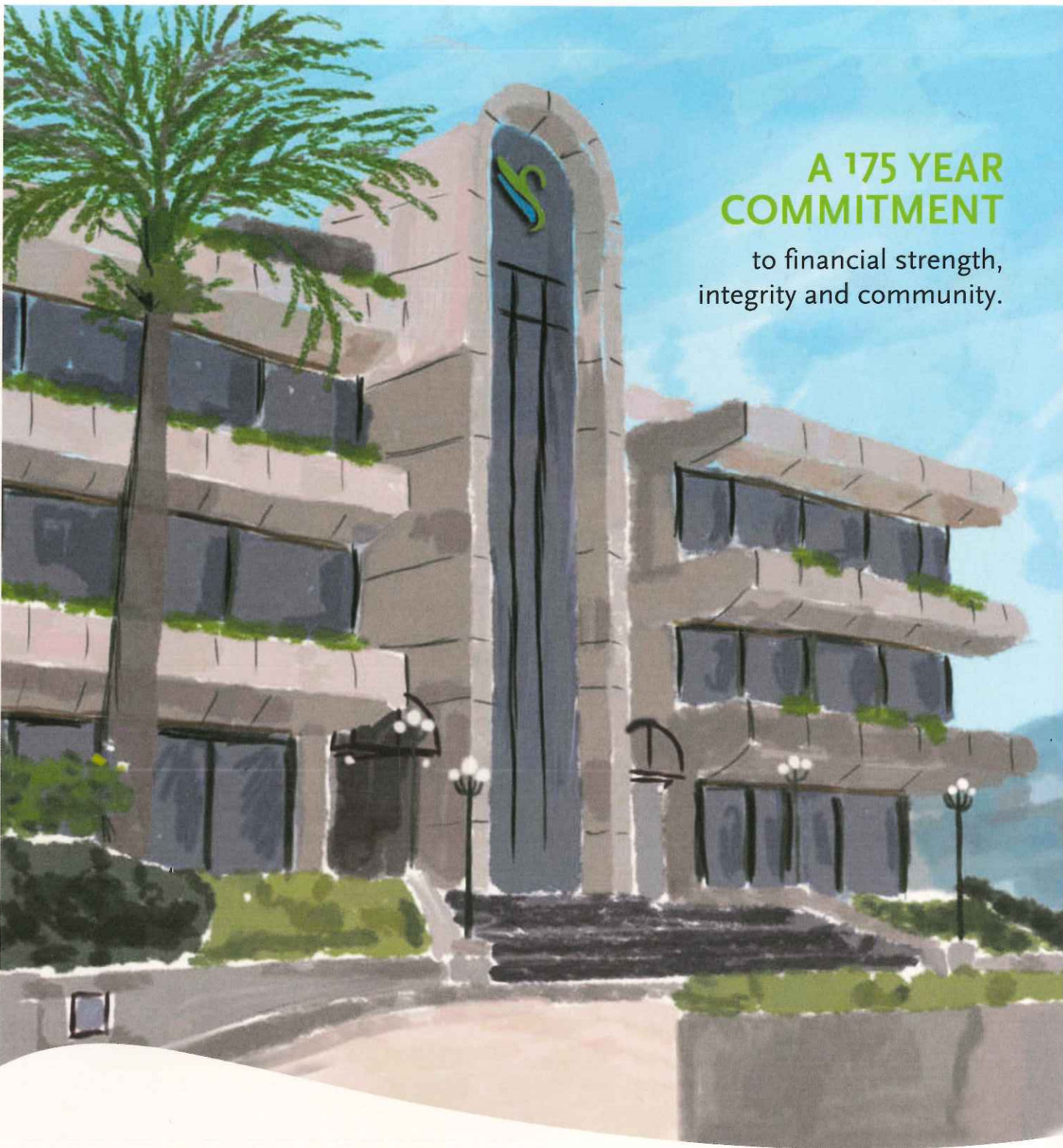
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
